A Saturday Tour to Remember

Christchurch and its immediate environs is a place that offers so much to remember. We have arranged a tour – called Regeneration Christchurch – at a cost of just \$35.00 per person, to show you just a fraction of the post-earthquake regeneration of this city and its beautiful surroundings.

Starting from the Burnside Bowling Club with a tour of the rebuild in the inner city, and a stop to explore the restored Arts Centre, the tour will then cruise the red-zoned residential area which is now green space, trees and proposed orchards and lakes.

A quick stop at New Brighton Pier to see our club's namesake – Pegasus Bay – and then we are off to Eastgate Mall where you can buy your own lunch from their extensive food court.

Through the beach suburb of Sumner and over the recently re-opened Evans Pass to the Port township of Lyttleton, and around the Lyttleton Harbour past some of the Banks Peninsula bays. Then we head over Dyers Pass, stopping at the Sign of the Kiwi to view Christchurch from the top of the Port Hills.

Back down in Christchurch suburbia we head for the new development called Wigram Skies, stopping for a nostalgic look at the Air Force Museum of New Zealand, before heading back to the Burnside Bowling Club by about 4.00pm in time to freshen up before the Happy Hour which starts at 6.00pm.

Seats are limited to 50, on a first-come firstserved basis, so register early if you want a seat. Toilets available at all stops – i.e Arts Centre, New Brighton, Eastgate Mall, and the Air Force Museum at Wigram, and there will also be time to buy refreshments.

Location

In case you didn't already know, the Nationals will be held at Burnside Bowling Club at 330 Avonhead Road, Avonhead, Christchurch.

This is quite near the airport, so for those of you who will be flying in, it's only a short taxi ride away.
